The tuition fee covers educational expenses such as courses, academic supervision, exams,

computers, printers, and such.
Payment terms and conditions
Tuition fees must be paid per semester, and it is not possible to pay in instalments (e.g. two instalments per semester). Students may also choose to pay for an entire academic year all at once. Payment is made for the completion of a total of 120 credit points, with a normal workload of 30 credit points per semester.
In the course of a semester, students have the right to complete as many activities offered within the programme (projects and/or courses) as they wish. Students enrolled in MSc programmes, who complete activities amounting to less than 30 credit points per semester, must also pay 7500 per
semester.
Students who have not completed their studies within the normal period of study have the right to
complete their studies in the course of another academic year without paying tuition fees.
Students who complete their studies in less than the normal number of semesters must pay tuition fees



Application fee
If you are a citizen from outside EU/EEA or Switzerland, as of October 2017 you are required to pay an application fee of DKK 750 (app. EUR 100), when applying for one or more master's degree programmes in the same application round. You will only have to pay the application fee once each application round regardless of whether you choose to apply for one, two or the maximum of three Master's degree programmes per application round.
British citizens applying in 2021 will be asked to apply by the EU-date of March 1st 2021. When you enter the Application Portal, you may be met with a demand of proof for paid application fee – depending on the outcome of the current negotiations. The application portal opens January 16, 2021. We expect the negotiations to have a clear outcome by this date.



We do not accept IELTS and TOEFL tests that are more than 2 years old at the time of the application deadline. We do not accept the "TOEFL MyBest Scores".
If you hold a Bachelor's degree from a Danish educational institution, and you took one of the mentioned tests less than two years before your bachelor admission with a score that meets our minimum requirements, it may be possible for you to be exempted from taking a new English test even if your test certificate is more than 2 years old. Please send us an email explaining your situation to hear more.
You can prove your language proficiency by uploading one of the following tests. The scores must be minimum:

Tuition fees

- A residence permit after the Danish Aliens Act, Consolidation section 9 m (1) as an accompanying child of a foreigner, who hold a residence permit based on employment etc. after the Danish Aliens Act, Consolidation section 9 a.
- A residence permit after Danish Aliens Act, Consolidation section 9 b (1) (foreigners with humanitarian protection status)
